The first thing I remember is cleaning out the former museum above the tavern at Catlin to make the move to Rossville. Rick and Randy were right in there sliding boxes down the back staircase.

For all the years since then, Rick was always available to discuss things, about the Chapter and the C&EI Railroad. When Bob McQuown passed away, Rick took over the Archives of the C&EI Collection at the Vermilion County Museum. He was tireless for the most part, in making sure that everything in those archives was relevant, and organized. The folks at that museum will miss him too...

He had two wonderful model railroads at his homes, and on the first one I assisted him with the construction of a fully-operable signal system. We had many good sessions there, but not enough on the second layout, as he had more health issues over those years.

So I don't know what we are going to do about this newsletter. I can't produce one like Rick did, nor do I want to. Henry has suggested that we just make up a sheet like this to feature some member articles, but I know that Rick struggled to get articles from members. We at least need to notify folks of the meetings, and have the minutes from the last one, which are below.

### Minutes from the May, 2025 meeting
